The City of Flagstaff is planning on constructing a new separated grade crossing by extending Fourth Street from the current intersection of Industrial/Huntington Drive to Route 66 and over the BNSF Railroad.

The City of Flagstaff, Parsons Brinkerhoff Quade & Douglas Inc. (Design Engineers), ADOT and BNSF have developed a very cohesive partnership that ensures the best project possible for all stakeholders. Presently there are three at-grade crossings in this area for the public to use including Fanning Dr., Steves Blvd. and Enterprise Rd. The Fourth Street crossing will reduce the traffic congestion at the three existing crossings and provide for better traffic and street movements.

Flagstaff voters approved the Fourth Street Railroad Crossing project in May 2000. Numerous open houses and meetings were conducted to receive input from the public on a preferred alternative and on the scope of the project.

Attached is a post construction simulation showing the existing and the new alignments. Also a vicinity map is attached that shows Fourth Street does not connect Route 66 and Huntington/Industrial at this time.





