FIRST
PROCEDURAL ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

On May 7, 2004, the Securities Division ("Division") of the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") filed a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing ("Notice") against Lonzo Archer ("Respondent") in which the Division alleged that Respondent's securities license had been revoked by the Securities Division of the Department of Financial Institutions of the State of Washington ("Washington Division") on January 27, 2004 for selling unsuitable investments to an elderly couple. The Final Order of the Washington Division was not appealed. The Division alleges that Respondent's actions and license revocation by the State of Washington constitute violations of the Arizona Securities Act ("Act") and are grounds to suspend or revoke his securities license registration in Arizona.

Respondent was duly served with copies of the Notice.

On June 10, 2004, Respondent, through New York counsel, filed a request for hearing and notice of appearance. Respondent's counsel did not submit evidence of admission Pro Hac Vice ("PHV") in compliance with Rule 33 of the Rules of the Arizona Supreme Court and evidence that he had paid the required filing fees.

Accordingly, Respondents' Request filed in response to the Notice should be held in abeyance pending Respondent's counsel filing a Motion and Consent for Admission Pro Hac Vice ("Motion PHV") with the Commission which establishes in compliance with Rule 33 of the Rules of the

1 Arizona Supreme Court and evidence that the required filing fees have been paid in a timely fashion.
2 Information concerning the Motion PHV may be found at the Commission's website,
3 www.cc.state.az.us.

4 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Request filed on behalf of Lonzo Archer shall be
5 held in abeyance for 60 days from the date of receipt of this Procedural Order by Respondent's
6 counsel.

7 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that upon the timely filing by Respondent's counsel of a Motion
8 PHV, a pre-hearing conference will be scheduled.

9 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if Respondent's counsel fails to file a Motion PHV in a
10 timely fashion as outlined above, then Respondent will be in default.

11 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, in the event Respondent is in default after 60 days from the
12 receipt of this Procedural Order for failure of counsel to comply with the above ordering paragraph,
13 the Division shall file, without filing a Motion for Default, a Default Order for Commission approval
14 in this matter.


