PROCEDURAL ORDER

17 **BY THE COMMISSION:**

18 On March 24, 2004, the Securities Division ("Division") of the Arizona Corporation
19 Commission ("Commission") filed a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing Regarding Proposed Order to
20 Cease and Desist, for Restitution, for Administrative Penalties, and For Other Affirmative Action
21 ("Notice") against Mee Diamond & Jewelry, Inc. and Christopher Mee ("Respondents") in which the
22 Division alleged that Respondents have engaged in acts, practices, and transactions that constitute
23 violations of the Arizona Securities Act ("Act") in connection with the offer and sale of securities in
24 the form of stock and investment contracts.

25 On April 2, 2004, Respondents, through their attorney, filed a Notice of Appearance and
26 Request for Hearing.

27 On April 8, 2004, by Procedural Order, a pre-hearing conference was scheduled on May 24,
28 2004.

On May 17, 2004, Respondents filed a Motion to Continue ("Motion") the pre-hearing due to
a scheduling conflict. The Division did not oppose the Motion, and would attempt to resolve the
issues raised in the Notice against Respondents in the interim.

On May 19, 2004, by Procedural Order, the proceeding was continued to July 8, 2004.

1 On July 8, 2004, the Division and Respondents appeared through counsel. It was agreed that
2 another pre-hearing conference should be scheduled on October 7, 2004.

3 On July 9, 2004, by Procedural Order, a pre-hearing conference was scheduled for October 7,
4 2004.

5 On August 25, 2004, the Division filed a motion to advance the pre-hearing conference from
6 October 7, 2004, because settlement negotiations had stalled.

7 On October 5, 2004, the Division filed a joint Stipulation to Continue the October 7, 2004,
8 pre-hearing conference due to a scheduling conflict which renders counsel for the Respondents to be
9 unavailable. The Division did not oppose the requested continuance so long as Respondents are
10 ordered to file their Answer by October 28, 2004 and a hearing is scheduled.

11 Accordingly, the pre-hearing conference should be vacated, Respondents should file their
12 Answer by October 28, 2004, and a hearing should be scheduled.

13 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the pre-hearing conference shall be vacated.

14 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Mee Diamond and Jewelry, Inc. and Christopher S. Mee
15 shall file their Answer by October 28, 2004.

16 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a hearing shall be held on January 25, 2005, at 9:30 a.m., at
17 the Commission's offices, 1200 West Washington Street, Phoenix, Arizona.

18 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the parties shall also reserve January 26 and 27, 2005 for
19 additional days of hearing, if necessary.

20 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the parties shall exchange copies of their witness lists and
21 exhibits and shall provide courtesy copies of same to the presiding Administrative Law Judge by 4:00
22 p.m. on January 7, 2005.

23 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Presiding Officer may rescind, alter, amend or waive
24 any portion of this Procedural Order by subsequent Procedural Order or by ruling at hearing.


