

**MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION
TO FILE REVISED STAFF REPORT**

Staff filed its Proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law on Checklist Item No. 7 on December 29, 2000 and on Checklist Item No. 10 on January 2, 2001. On January 19, 2002, WorldCom, Inc. ("WorldCom") and AT&T Communications of the Mountain States, Inc. ("AT&T") filed comments on the Staff Reports. Pursuant to the Procedural Order, Staff's Revised Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law are due on Monday, January 29, 2001. Staff hereby moves for an extension of time to file its revised Checklist Reports until February 2, 2001. The extension of time is necessary because AT&T informed Staff counsel this week that they would be unavailable to discuss and agree on any revisions to the Reports until the Report's due date, Monday, January 29, 2001.
