On July 8, 1999, I attended a hearing at the Commission Offices in Tucson concerning an Application for the Extension of Certificate of Convenience and Necessity of Trico Electric Cooperative, Inc. At that time, representing my husband, Ralph S. Wilson, and Falcon Valley Ranch, the owners of the proposed land in question, I voiced our objections to Trico becoming our exclusive electric service provider. We were already part of the San Carlos Irrigation Project (SCIP) network with twelve electric sites in the surrounding area and did not want to change providers or to be limited in our choice of providers when developing more service sites.

During the hearing, I was told that SCIP, as a extension of the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the U. S. Department of Interior, was not affected or limited by private electric companies' service areas and that we would not automatically become a part of the Trico customer base even if we were within their service area. I was asked to provide a list of our SCIP electric service sites to the Commission, which I did in a letter dated July 16, 1999 addressed to Jane Rodda (enclosed).

I understand that Trico is now hoping to expand its service area through the Falcon Valley and over more of our ranch, specifically in the Willow Springs area (Docket No.- 014610393). Again, Trico would be overlapping areas that are currently being provided electricity by SCIP and areas that although they have no service at this time, areas that we would like the ability to be served by SCIP.

We have been customers of SCIP since May 1951, adding more electric demand sites as we have developed our ranch, we now have fifteen service sites (map encl). The Irrigation Project was been the only provider in our area, giving us reliable service at

rates consistently lower than other utility companies in adjacent areas. We do not want to lose our relationship with SCIP.

We have nothing in writing from the Commission confirming my understanding of our ability to remain with SCIP, although there may be overlapping into Trico's service areas, or our ability to request that SCIP be a future electric provider within an area deemed by the Commission to exclusively that of Trico.

This matter is of great concern to us and we would greatly appreciate a statement from the Commission addressing these issues.


