Dear Commissioners:

I am writing to you to clarify statements made in a letter I received on 1/18/2005, which was sent to Thomas Campbell of Lewis and Rocca LLP, from William Sullivan. The letter was faxed to me from Mr. Sullivan's office representing Mohave Cooperative.

In Mr. Sullivan's letter it states that MEC had entered into discussions with CTI concerning installing generators to resolve CTI power needs. The statement that MEC had spoken with myself is true. However the contact was made on 1/18/2005. This is the first time MEC has spoken to me since my involvement in this issue. I was contacted by Aaron Stallings of MEC by phone at about 11 am on 1/18/2005. Mr. Stallings stated that he was in receipt of the letter that I wrote to Mr. Longtin of MEC, and he understood why I was upset. Mr. Stallings told me that he wanted to correct the problem, by leasing the generator that I now use for power, and that MEC was willing to install a larger generator to service the building, when it is erected. I neither accepted nor declined Mr. Stallings offer.

I received Mr. Sullivan's letter at 4 pm on 1/18/2005, thirty minutes after I received Judge Node's recommendation. The letter implies there have been ongoing negotiations between CTI and MEC. There has not been any ongoing negotiations. There was also a voice message left on my voice mail on the evening of 1/18/2005 from Mr. Stallings, which he states he wants to speak with me further on the generators. The letter and phone calls are what CTI believes to be a last ditch attempt by MEC to lead the Commission to believe that MEC is dealing with CTI in good faith. When in fact MEC has refused to deal with CTI for months. MEC still holds \$4500.00 of CTI money for power that was promised, and never delivered. CTI feels that MEC has not dealt with CTI in good faith, and the only reason for the sudden change of heart, is due to Judge Nodes recommendation. The offer of generator power by MEC is ridicules and insulting, when electricity is available.
