Dear Chairman Woodall:

As I have driven around Casa Grande recently, I have admired its wide, open skies, uncluttered by tall buildings or other obstructions. Now, this may just be a *me* thing, but wouldn't the installation of giant kV500 transmission lines straight down McCartney Road, near the airport, past the high school, homes and new residential developments to points beyond, that SRP has proposed, be intrusive and inhibitive to growth and future development of Casa Grande?

I think so.

And, it's not as if these giant transmission lines, looming straight down the middle of Casa Grande, through populated areas slated for tremendous growth and development, would be easy to ignore. Let's face it – the lines are ugly.

The thing I have wondered about is the number of hearings that have been held in the past few months at which City officials, including our Mayor, leaders of other organizations in Casa Grande and other area residents, have clearly and repeatedly stated their opinions that the preferred route for placement of these lines would be the southernmost and westernmost routes in Casa Grande – the least populated and with the least amount of planned growth in the near future.
