On July 23, 2004, Arizona Electric Power Cooperative, Inc. ("AEPSCO") and Southwest Transmission Cooperative, Inc. ("SWTC") (collectively "Applicants") filed applications with the Arizona Corporation Commission for rate increases. AEPSCO's Application indicates it is requesting an approximate 10 percent increase in revenue. SWTC's Application indicates it is requesting an approximate 14 percent revenue increase. The actual percentage rate increase for individual customers will vary depending upon the type and quantity of service provided. The applications have been consolidated for purposes of a hearing. Copies of the applications and proposed tariffs are available at the Commission's offices for public inspection during regular business hours and at the Applicants offices: 1000 S. Highway 80, Benson, Ariz. 85602.

The Commission will hold a hearing on this matter beginning April 14, 2005 at 10:00 a.m. at the Commission's offices, Room 222, 400 West Congress, Tucson, Arizona. Public comments will be taken on the first day of the hearing.

The law provides for an open public hearing at which, under appropriate circumstances, interested parties may intervene. Intervention shall be permitted to any person entitled by law to intervene and having a direct and substantial interest in the matter. Persons desiring to intervene must

file a written motion to intervene with the Commission, which motion should be sent to the Cooperative or its counsel and to all parties of record, and which, at the minimum, shall contain the following:

1. The name, address, and telephone number of the proposed intervenor and of any party upon whom service of documents is to be made if different than the intervenor.
2. A short statement of the proposed intervenor's interest in the proceeding (e.g., a customer of the Cooperative, a stockholder of the Company, etc.).
3. A statement certifying that a copy of the motion to intervene has been mailed to the Cooperative or its counsel and to all parties of record in the case.

The granting of motions to intervene shall be governed by A.A.C. R14-3-105, except that all motions to intervene must be filed on or before February 23, 2005. The granting of intervention, among other things, entitles a party to present sworn evidence at the hearing and to cross-examine other witnesses. However, failure to intervene will not preclude any interested person or entity from appearing at the hearing and providing public comment on the application or from filing written comments in the record of the case. You will not receive any further notice of this proceeding unless you request it.
