PROCEDURAL ORDER

**BY THE COMMISSION:**

By Procedural Orders dated March 16, 2005 and March 23, 2005, the hearing in the above-captioned matters convened on June 29, 2005.

By Procedural Order dated July 7, 2005, the Hearing Division granted Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") Utility Division Staff's ("Staff") request to re-open the hearing in order to address new information concerning the application that had come to Staff's attention after the hearing as well as revisions to the rate design that were proposed at the hearing. Coronado Utilities, Inc. ("Coronado" or "Company") agreed that the new information was best considered in the context of an evidentiary hearing. The re-opened hearing was set for July 22, 2005.

On July 11, 2005, Staff filed a Request to Reset Hearing Date. Staff requested that the re-opened hearing be re-set to no earlier than two weeks after August 11, 2005. Staff's request is based on issues raised in a large number of customer letters that have been filed in this case, a desire to gather factual information concerning BHP's operations, and the sentencing hearing for Santac that is set for August 11, 2005. Staff requests that Coronado be required to re-notice the re-opened hearing and that Coronado provide a witness from BHP who can provide information about customer

1 complaints and background information that would be helpful in determining whether BHP is a  
2 public service corporation.

3 Several important issues have arisen following the June 29, 2005 hearing, and it is in the  
4 public interest to continue the re-opened hearing set for July 22, 2005, in order to consider the issues  
5 addressed in Staff's July 11, 2005 Request.


6 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the **hearing** in this matter currently set to re-commence  
7 on **July 22, 2005**, shall be continued indefinitely until further Order of the Commission.

8 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a **Procedural Conference** for the purpose of discussing  
9 the points raised in our July 7, 2005, Procedural Order and Staff's July 11, 2005, Request shall  
10 commence on **July 22, 2005**, at **10:00 a.m.** at the Commission's Tucson offices, Room 222, 400  
11 West Congress St. Tucson, Arizona. The parties may appear telephonically. The phone number for  
12 telephonically participating in the hearing is **(602) 542-9007**.

13 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the time clock under R14-2-103 is suspended pending  
14 resolution of the issues leading to the re-opening of the record.

15 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Presiding Officer may rescind, alter, amend, or waive  
16 any portion of this Procedural Order either by subsequent Procedural Order or by ruling at hearing.
