Introduction:

On December 23, 1999, American MetroComm Long Distance Corp., L.L.C. ("American Metro" or "Applicant") filed with the Commission an Application for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("Certificate") to provide competitive intrastate telecommunications services as a facilities-based provider and reseller.

Background and Staff Analysis:

American Metro was sent a Data Request on April 28, May 18 and again on June 23, 2000 for additional information missing from the Application. On August 9, 2000, a letter and the previously requested information were docketed in the form of Data Requests. This letter and attached Data Requests required the Applicant to submit responses to the Docket Control Center within 71 days. American Metro was notified in the correspondence that failure to respond within 71 days of the date on this letter would result in Staff's recommendation that the Application be terminated.

Since American Metro failed to respond to these Data Requests within 71 days (October 19, 2000), Staff believes that termination of this application for a Certificate is in the public interest.

Recommendations:

Staff recommends termination of American Metro's application for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity, without prejudice.
