Dear Chairman Mundell:

The attached Competitive Exchange and Network Services Price Cap Tariff pages are being filed to introduce a new service known as Number Forwarding. Pursuant to the terms of the recently approved Settlement Agreement in Docket No. T-01051B-99-0105, Qwest is requesting that Number Forwarding be included as a Basket 3 service as provided for in Section 4(a) of the Price Cap plan.

Number Forwarding will allow a residence customer to have a telephone number identity without having it terminate in an exchange access line. Calls placed to the telephone number can be forwarded to any other pre-arranged number within the same local calling area. (A \$10.00 nonrecurring charge applies to change the number to which calls are forwarded.) This service is provided with one listing in the appropriate white page directory. Long distance calls may be billed to the Number Forwarding telephone number through the use of a credit card. Collect or third number billing to the Number Forwarding number will not be allowed. Number Forwarding will be offered at a monthly rate of \$6.95 and a nonrecurring rate of \$10.00. The main identified application for this service is in connection with the provisioning of Anywhere Voice Mail. However, it may also be of benefit to individuals who have no need for traditional exchange access service and are able to arrange for their calls to be answered by another party.

The proposed price for Number Forwarding is above its TSLRIC cost, as required by A.A.C. R14-2-1310, as well as Section 4(e) of the Price Cap plan. These pages have been prepared with an effective date of May 2, 2001. We request the Commission's concurrence in this matter. 5.4.19 NUMBER FORWARDING

(N)

A. Description

Number Forwarding allows a residence customer to have a telephone number identity without having an exchange access line. Calls placed to the telephone number can be forwarded to any other telephone number within the same local calling area.

B. Terms and Conditions

1. The number of incoming calls placed to the telephone number is limited to 5 calls within 5 minutes. Once the threshold has been exceeded, the calling party will hear an announcement indicating that the call cannot be completed at this time.
2. One listing in the white page directories is provided with this service covering the exchange in which the Number Forwarding central office is located.
3. Collect or third-number billing will not be allowed to the Number Forwarding number.
4. Number Forwarding is offered subject to the availability of facilities.
5. Long distance calls may be billed to the Number Forwarding number through the use of a calling card.
6. Number Forwarding customers who establish exchange access line service may reuse the Number Forwarding telephone number if service is established in the same local calling area as the Number Forwarding telephone number.
7. The service is not offered where the terminating telephone is a pay telephone.

C. Rates and Charges

Subsequent to the initial establishment of service, the appropriate nonrecurring charge will also apply to change the Number Forwarding number, and to change the number to which the calls are forwarded.
