



14 BY THE COMMISSION:

FINDINGS OF FACT

15 1. Tucson Electric Power Company ("TEP") is certificated to provide electric service as a
 16 public service corporation in the State of Arizona.

17 2. On May 10, 2002, TEP filed an application for approval of new partial requirements
 18 service tariffs, modification of existing partial requirements service tariff 101, and elimination of
 19 qualifying facility tariffs.

20 3. Staff has recommended that the application be suspended for 120 days so that Staff can
 21 have sufficient time to evaluate the application.

22 4. Staff has also recommended that TEP notify all of its customers of this filing. TEP
 23 should submit within 15 days of this Decision the proposed notice language to the Utilities Division
 24 Director ("Director") for review and approval. After notification to TEP by the Director that the
 25 proposed notice language has been approved, TEP should provide this notice in its next regular bill
 26 or by special mailing, or a combination of both. The notice shall not be more than 30 days from the
 27 date of approval of the notice language by the Director.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1
2 1. TEP is an Arizona public service corporation within the meaning of Article XV, Section
3 2, of the Arizona Constitution.

4 2. The Commission has jurisdiction over TEP and over the subject matter of the
5 application.

6 3. The Commission, having reviewed the application and Staff's Memorandum dated May
7 16, 2002, concludes that it is in the public interest to suspend the application for a period of one
8 hundred twenty (120) days.


ORDER

10 THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the application be and hereby is suspended until and
11 including October 7, 2002.


12 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that TEP shall notify all of its customers of this filing, using the
