12 FINDINGS OF FACT

13 1. Navajo Communications Company ("Navajo") is certified to provide intrastate
14 telecommunications service as a public service corporation in the State of Arizona.

15 2. On May 7, 2001, Navajo filed revisions to its General Exchange Tariff:

- 16 General Exchange Tariff - Arizona
- 17 Section 0, 3rd Revised Sheet No. 1.1
- 18 Section 30, Original Sheet No. 1
- 19 Section 30, Original Sheet No. 2
- 20 Section 30, Original Sheet No. 3
- 21 Section 30, Original Sheet No. 4
- 22 Section 30, Original Sheet No. 5
- 23 Section 30, Original Sheet No. 6
- Section 30, Original Sheet No. 7
- Section 30, Original Sheet No. 8
- Section 30, Original Sheet No. 9
- Section 30, Original Sheet No. 10

24 3. This filing introduces five new calling plans that allow customers to extend their local
25 calling scope for an additional flat monthly fee.

26 4. The fee is in addition to their existing local service fee.

27 5. Subscribers to these plans will be able to place unlimited calls to certain exchanges
28 within Navajo's territory. These calls would otherwise be billed on a per minute basis as toll calls.

1 6. Navajo's customers will have the option to subscribe to one of these plans or to
2 continue with their current toll calling arrangement.

3 7. The five plans are as follows:

- 4 • The Western District Plan allows subscribers unlimited calling within the eight
5 western Navajo exchanges for a price of \$11.95 for residential customers and
6 \$25.95 for business customers.
- 7 • The Central District Plan allows subscribers unlimited calling within the seven
8 central Navajo exchanges for a price of \$11.50 for residential customers and
9 \$24.95 for business customers.
- 10 • The Northern District Plan allows subscribers unlimited calling within the nine
11 northern Navajo exchanges for a price of \$13.95 for residential customers and
12 \$15.50 for business customers.
- 13 • The Southern District Plan allows subscribers unlimited calling within the twelve
14 southern Navajo exchanges for a price of \$15.95 for residential customers and
15 \$26.95 for business customers.
- 16 • The Navajo Nationwide Plan allows subscribers unlimited calling within all thirty-
17 nine of Navajo's exchanges for a price of \$17.95 for residential customers and
18 \$38.95 for business customers.

16 8. Navajo has provided Staff with cost and revenue impact analysis for these plans.
17 Navajo's analysis indicates that the net effect of the introduction of these plans will be an increase in
18 annual revenues of \$7,674.

19 9. Staff believes that the introduction of these plans will provide Navajo's customers with
20 additional and desirable toll calling options.

21 10. Staff recommends approval of this filing.

22 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

23 1. Navajo is an Arizona public service corporation within the meaning of Article XV,
24 Section 2, of the Arizona Constitution.

25 2. The Commission has jurisdiction over Navajo and over the subject matter of the
26 application.
