PROCEDURAL ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

On August 30, 2001, the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") issued Decision No. 63979 which granted Telseon Carrier Services, Inc. ("Telseon") a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("CC&N") to provide competitive facilities-based and resold local exchange, interexchange, and exchange access telecommunications services in Arizona.

Pursuant to Decision No. 63979, Telseon's CC&N was contingent on, among other things, Telseon filing a performance bond in the amount of \$100,000 the earlier of 90 days from the date of the Decision or 30 days prior to the commencement of service in Arizona.

On October 12, 2001, Telseon filed a request for a waiver of the bond requirement or, in the alternative, that Telseon be prohibited from collecting customer deposits until such time as the bond requirement is met.

On October 30, 2001, Staff filed a recommendation that Telseon's request for waiver of the bond requirement should be denied, but that Telseon's alternative proposal should be adopted. Accordingly, Staff recommended that Telseon should be prohibited from collecting deposits until a performance bond of \$100,000 is filed.

Telseon's request for waiver of the bond requirement is denied. However, Telseon will be granted an extension of time until August 30, 2002 or 30 days prior to commencement of service, whichever occurs first.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Telseon Carrier Services, Inc. shall file its \$100,000

1 performance bond in accordance with the requirement of Decision No. 63979 by no later than August
2 30, 2002 or 30 days prior to providing service in Arizona, whichever occurs first. No additional
3 extensions will be granted and failure to comply with the above-stated conditions will result in
4 voidance of Telseon's CC&N without further order of the Commission. In the event that Telseon
5 fails to comply with all conditions, thereby resulting in voidance of its CC&N, a new application for
6 CC&N authority must be filed by the Applicant and approved by the Commission prior to
7 commencement of service.


