
Dear Current or Prospective Willow Valley Water Co., Inc. Customer:

Willow Valley Water Co., Inc. (the "Company") holds a certificate of convenience and necessity from the Arizona Corporation Commission to provide domestic water service in all of the developed area in the general vicinity of your property (and is the only water provider within a reasonable proximity of your property). Under applicable state law (A.R.S. § 40-282), the Company has the right to extend service to areas contiguous to its existing certificated area. The Company has been providing potable water service to the Willow Valley Marina for over 10 years. The Company also holds a franchise from Mohave County to serve water in the area in which your property is located. When Willow Valley Estates 20, Tracts 4134A and B were being developed, the Company was requested by the developer to provide water service to the subdivision. The Company agreed to do so and service lines already have been extended to all lots in the subdivision.

In order to ensure that the entire subdivision in which your property is located is recognized by the Arizona Corporation Commission as being within the Company's officially certificated area, the Company recently filed a formal application with the Commission to clarify that the boundaries of its certificate of convenience and necessity will include all the lands within Willow Valley Estates 20, Tracts 4134A and B and the adjoining properties up to the current east bank of the Colorado River. The Company is required to give all potentially affected property owners a copy of the Commission's official notice relating to the hearing to be conducted on the Company's Application and you will find a copy of that notice on the reverse side of this letter. This is a mere formality and it requires no action on your part unless you wish to object to having water service available from the Company. This is not a rate hearing, but is only concerned with the formal extension/clarification of the current certificated area of the Company.
