

PUBLIC NOTICE OF HEARING
PURSUANT TO A.R.S. § 40-252
CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION
OF THE ARIZONA INDEPENDENT
SYSTEM ADMINISTRATOR (AISA)
Docket No. E-00000A-02-0051,
E-00000A-01-0630 et al.

The Arizona Corporation Commission, in Decision No. 65743 (March 14, 2003) directed that a proceeding be noticed and held in compliance with A.R.S. § 40-252 to allow notice and an opportunity to be heard to affected parties concerning the continuation of the AISA. The Commission may, pursuant to A.R.S. § 40-252, after hearing, enter such orders as may be appropriate relating to electric restructuring. Such orders may include variances from Commission rules or prior Commission Decisions, and/or modifications to prior Commission Decisions pursuant to A.R.S. § 40-252. Copies of the report of the Commission's Staff on this matter, as well as the pre-filed testimony of parties, will be available at the Commission's offices for public inspection during regular business hours.

The Commission will hold a public hearing on this matter beginning **September 11, 2003 at 10:00 a.m.** at the Commission's offices, 1200 West Washington Street, Phoenix, Arizona. Public comments will be taken on the first day of the hearing. The law provides for an open public hearing at which, under appropriate circumstances, interested parties may intervene. Intervention shall be permitted to any person entitled by law to intervene and having a direct and substantial interest in the matter. Persons desiring to intervene must file a written motion to intervene with the Commission no later than **July 21, 2003**. The motion to intervene must be sent to all parties of record, and shall contain the following:

1. The name, address, and telephone number of the proposed intervenor and of any party upon whom service of documents is to be made if different than the intervenor;
2. A short statement of the proposed intervenor's interest in the proceeding; and
3. A statement certifying that a copy of the motion to intervene has been mailed to all parties of record in the proceeding.

The granting of intervention, among other things, entitles a party to present sworn evidence at the hearing and to cross-examine other witnesses. However, failure to intervene will not preclude any interested person or entity from appearing at the hearing and providing public comment or from filing written comments in the record of the case. You will not receive any further notice of this proceeding unless you request it.

The Commission does not discriminate on the basis of disability in admission to its public meetings.
