BY THE COMMISSION:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Arizona Public Service ("APS") is certificated to provide electric service as a public service corporations in the State of Arizona.
2. On March 22, 2001, APS filed an application to introduce a new tariff for Commission approval. The tariff is identified as Station Use Service tariff (Schedule E-36). The proposed tariff, would apply to large (3 MW or greater) generating facilities requiring start-up and auxiliary power.
3. Staff has recommended that the application be suspended for sixty (60) days so that Staff can have sufficient time to evaluate the application.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. APS is an Arizona public service corporations within the meaning of Article XV, Section 2, of the Arizona Constitution.
2. The Commission has jurisdiction over APS and over the subject matter of the application.
3. The Commission, having reviewed the application and Staff's Memorandum dated March 30, 2001, concludes that it is in the public interest to suspend the application for a period of sixty (60) days.
