**POST-HEARING REPLY BRIEF OF
ARIZONA PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY**

Pursuant to the direction of the Administrative Law Judge in the above-captioned matter, Arizona Public Service Company ("APS" or "Company") hereby submits its Post-Hearing Reply Brief to Staff's Closing Brief. In this Reply Brief, APS addresses two items that APS believes are not opposed by any party to this matter, but which were not specifically discussed in Staff's Closing Brief or Staff's Proposed Code of Conduct.¹

A. The Proposed Code of Conduct Should Allow for Electronic Affidavits from Shared Employees.

APS did not oppose Staff's recommendation that Shared Employees acknowledge that they cannot act as a conduit of Confidential Information. To allow for such

1 acknowledgements to occur as part of APS' training plan for the Code of Conduct,
2 however, APS requested and Staff agreed that the "affidavits" could be either in writing
3 or made electronically. [Tr. at p.62, ll. 18-25, (B. Keene)] This approach is consistent
4 with how the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission addressed a similar issue in its
5 Standards of Conduct rulemaking. *See* Order 2004-A, 101 FERC ¶61, 032 at 185. As
6 requested by Staff, APS will provide Staff the opportunity to review APS' proposed
7 electronic acknowledgement. [Tr. at p.33, ll. 5-8 (J. Guldner)]

8 Accordingly, APS requests that the clause "in writing or electronically in a form
9 acceptable to Staff" be inserted between the words "affidavit" and "stating" in Part Two,
10 Section IV (G) of Staff's Proposed Code of Conduct or otherwise included in the
11 Proposed Code of Conduct adopted by the Administrative Law Judge.

12 **B. The Term "Corporate Governance" Should Be Added to the**
13 **Definition of Shared Services in the Proposed Code of Conduct.**

14 Pinnacle West Capital Corporation provides corporate governance to APS and its
15 affiliates—a function that is both required by laws such as Sarbanes-Oxley and wholly
16 consistent with the concept of "shared services" in prior Codes of Conduct approved by
17 the Commission. To ensure clarity, APS recommended that the term "corporate
18 governance" be explicitly identified in the definition of "Shared Services" in the
19 Proposed Code of Conduct. [Tr. at p. 23, ll. 13-19 (J. Guldner)] No party opposed this
20 recommendation. [Tr. at p.63, ll. 17-20 (B. Keene)]

21 Accordingly, APS requests that the words "corporate governance" be inserted in
22 the definition of "Shared Services" in Part One of Staff's Proposed Code of Conduct or
23 the Proposed Code of Conduct adopted by the Administrative Law Judge.
