Response to Staff's Second Set of Data Requests
Docket No. T-20434A-05-0900

1. In Item A-1 of the Application, the Company indicated that it wants to be a provider of Resold Local Exchange Telecommunications Services and Facilities-Based Local Exchange Services. In Item A-14 of the Application, YMax does not indicate that it will post a \$25,000 performance bond as a Local Exchange Reseller, but will post a \$100,000 bond to provide facilities-based Local Exchange Service.

Please understand that it is the Commission's policy to require a performance bond for each service offered to customers. Since Applicant states in its Response to Staff in Item 5 that it will amend its application to withdraw its request for Resold Local Exchange Authority, it does not have to post a \$25,000 performance bond for this service. Please amend the application.

Response:

YMax will amend its application to withdraw its request for Resold Local Exchange Authority.

2. Applicant states in Item 8 of Staff's First Set of Data Requests that it is authorized to provide Facilities-Based Local Exchange and Interexchange Telecommunications Services in the state of Florida, Iowa, Maryland (local only), Pennsylvania, Texas and Wisconsin. However, it did not specify the rates that it would charge for these services in these other jurisdictions because it is a start-up company. If the Company has now initiated operations in any of these states, please specify the actual rates. If operations have not been initiated in any state, please specify the rates that are contemplated to be charged. Also, if rates are different in any other jurisdiction from the rates to be charged in Arizona for similar services, please indicate the amount of the difference and provide an explanation for the difference in rates.

Response:

YMax has not yet initiated operations in any state. It contemplates charging the same rates in other states as it will charge in Arizona for comparable services.

3. In Item 10 of Staff's First Set of Data Requests, the Applicant states that it will provide a copy of the interconnection agreement between itself and Qwest upon the latter's execution. Please provide such interconnection agreement. If the agreement has not yet been executed by Qwest, an unexecuted version of the agreement is acceptable.

Response:

YMax is still in negotiations with Qwest. The interconnection agreement will be filed with the Commission by Qwest in a separate docket upon execution. YMax will reference that filing in its compliance filings once it is granted a certificate in this proceeding. The interconnection agreement is a standard agreement that consists of hundreds of pages; the standard Qwest agreements can be viewed online at Qwest's website.

4. Applicant indicates in response to Item 11 in Staff's First Set of Data Requests that it has interconnection agreements with BellSouth and Verizon, and is in negotiation with AT&T/SBC for its operations in other states. As requested in Item 11, please list the number and types of interconnection agreements Applicant has entered into with these companies and provide those interconnection agreements and any other supporting documentation.

Response:

As stated previously, YMax has executed multi-state agreements with BellSouth and Verizon and is still in negotiations with AT&T/SBC. These agreements are all standard interconnection/resale agreements available to all CLECs. They consist of hundreds of pages and would be burdensome to reproduce. The standard agreements can generally be viewed online at the websites of the various ILECs.
