

**PUBLIC NOTICE OF HEARING ON THE APPLICATION OF SONOITA VALLEY WATER COMPANY, A SOLE PROPRIETORSHIP, TO TRANSFER ITS ASSETS TO SONOITA VALLEY WATER COMPANY, AN ARIZONA CORPORATION.**

On December 16, 2005, E.H. Lewis dba Sonoita Valley Water Company ("Applicant") filed an application with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("commission") to transfer its assets to Sonoita Valley Water Company, an Arizona corporation. The Applicant indicates that management of the utility will remain unchanged. If the Application is granted, the transferee will be the exclusive provider of water service in the proposed service territory, and will be required by the Commission to provide service under rates and charges and terms and conditions established by the Commission. The Application is available for inspection during regular business hours at the offices of the Commission in Phoenix, at 1200 West Washington Street, Phoenix, Arizona, in Tucson, at 400 West Congress St., Suite 218, Tucson, Arizona or on the Commission's website, [azcc.gov](http://azcc.gov), by using the eDocket link, as well as at the offices of the Applicant located at 2102 N. Forbes Blvd., Ste. 107, Tucson, AZ 85745.

The Commission will hold a hearing on this matter beginning May 10, 2006, at 10:00 a.m. at the Commission's offices, Room 222, 400 West Congress Street, Tucson, AZ. Public comment will be taken at the beginning of the hearing.

The law provided for an open public hearing at which, under appropriate circumstance, interested persons may intervene in the proceedings and participate as a party. You may have the right to intervene in the proceeding. Intervention will be in accordance with A.A.C. R14-3-105, expect that all motions to intervene must file a written motion to intervene with the Commission and send such motion to Applicant or its counsel and to all parties of record. The motion must, at the minimum, contain the following:

1. The name, address, and telephone number of the proposed intervener and of any party upon whom service of documents is to be made if different from that of the intervener.
2. A short statement of the proposed interveners interest in the proceeding (e.g., a customer or potential customer of the Applicant, a shareholder of the Applicant, etc.).
3. A statement certifying that a copy of the motion to intervene has been mailed to the Applicant or its counsel and to all parties of record in the case.

The granting of intervention, among other things, entitles a party to present sworn evidence at the hearing and to cross-examine other witnesses. However, failure to intervene will not preclude any interested person or entity from appearing at the hearing and providing public comment on the applications. You will not receive any further notice of this proceeding unless you request it. Comments may also be made by writing to the Commission in care of Docket Control,
