To Whom it May Concern:

NEXTLINK Long Distance Services, Inc. was granted a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("CC&N") to provide competitive facilities-based and resold intrastate and interstate telecommunications services in Arizona by Decision No. 62770, dated August 2, 2000, in Docket No. T-03775A-99-0494. On December 18, 2001, NEXTLINK Long Distance Services, Inc. notified the Commission by letter that its name had been changed to XO Long Distance Services, Inc.

XO Long Distance Services, Inc. does not serve any Arizona customers under its Arizona CC&N nor has it ever accepted any prepaid advances or deposits. (This was also true when the company was known as NEXTLINK Long Distance Services, Inc.) Attached is a verification from Rex Knowles, Vice President, Regulatory, with XO Communications (the parent company of XO Long Distance), confirming that XO Long Distance has no Arizona customers and does not hold any prepayments or deposits.

The recent restructuring of XO Communications, approved by the Commission in Decision 65520, has prompted the company to adopt a new business plan. Under this plan, XO Communications, Inc. has no plans to use its subsidiary XO Long Distance Services, Inc. to provide long distance services in Arizona. Consequently, XO Long Distance Services, Inc. does not need its CC&N and requests that the Commission cancel its CC&N. In conjunction with



relinquishment of its CC&N, XO Long Distance Services, Inc. also withdraws its Arizona Interexchange Services Tariff. All services provided pursuant to the CC&N granted XO Long Distance by the Commission in Docket No. T-03775A-99-0494 will continue uninterrupted by XO Arizona, Inc.


