

**PUBLIC NOTICE OF HEARING ON THE APPLICATION OF UTILITY SOURCE, LLC, FOR AN INCREASE IN ITS RATES FOR WATER AND WASTEWATER SERVICE (DOCKET NO. WS-04235A-06-0303)**

On May 1, 2006, as later supplemented, Utility Source, LLC ("Utility Source" or "Company") filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") an application for an increase in operating income of approximately 99 percent (\$2,474,357). Under the Utility Source proposal, a typical residential customer's bill for water service (based on usage of 4,740 gallons per month) would increase from current charges of \$19.90 per month to \$66.13 per month (approximately 232 percent). Under the Company's proposal, a typical residential customer's bill for wastewater service (based on water usage of 4,740 gallons per month) would increase from current charges of \$12.94 per month to \$34.51 per month (approximately 167 percent).

The Commission's Utilities Division Staff has not yet made a recommendation regarding the Company's rate increase proposal, and the Commission will determine the appropriate rate relief to be granted based on the evidence of record in this proceeding. The

Commission is not bound by the proposals made by the Company, Staff, or any intervenors and therefore, the final rates approved in this docket may be lower or higher than the rates described above. Copies of the application and proposed tariffs are available at the Company's offices at:

The Commission will hold a hearing on this matter beginning January 22, 2007, at 10:00 a.m. at the Commission's offices, 1200 West Washington, Phoenix, Arizona. Public comments will be taken on the first day of the hearing.

The law provides for an open public hearing at which, under appropriate circumstances interested parties may intervene. Intervention shall be permitted to any person entitled by law to intervene and having a direct and substantial interest in the matter. Persons desiring to intervene must file a written motion to intervene with the Commission no later than November 15, 2006. The motion to intervene must be sent to the Company or its counsel and to all parties of record, and must contain the following:

1. The name, address, and telephone number of the proposed intervenor and of any party upon whom service of document is to be made if different from the intervenor.
2. A short statement of the proposed intervenor's interest in the proceeding (e.g. a customer of the Company, a shareholder of the Company, etc.)
3. A statement certifying that a copy of the motion to intervene has been mailed to the Company or its counsel and to all parties of record in the case.

The granting of intervention, among other things, entitles a party to present sworn evidence at the hearing and to cross-examine other witnesses. However, failure to intervene will not preclude any interested person or entity from appearing at the hearing and providing public comment on the application or from filing written comments in the record of the case. You will not receive any further notice of this proceeding unless you request it.
