I live in Sedona and I protest the thought that I have to pay for all the infrastructure that APS is putting in for the housing in Phoenix. I know it cost millions but that should be paid for by the developers or the homeowners in the new homes. The utilities to my house have been in the ground since the late 60's and they fail a lot - and APS is spending NO MONEY replacing them. They just wait until they fail and then fix them. I have had 2 power outages in the last month, one lasting several hours, and they always come around splicing conductors on the ground from one transformer to another or replacing fuses. Then they dig it up and fix it. They even closed the office here so the guy comes from Cottonwood or wherever, and it takes hours to get here. I once talked to Kent Jones (former Sedona office manager) about helping them check the lines, I am a retired electrical engineer and know how to do that, and he said they don't do that, they just wait for failures and fix them!! You say they are installing infrastructure, how about us who are paying for new infrastructure and not getting it. Your Mr Mayes put it correctly when he said in the article in the newspaper today, "the utility needs to show some innovation such as proposing hook-up fees to new development to take some of the financial burden off existing customers". Let the developers pay for the infrastructure, they are making millions while I sit in the dark. Do it now, make it equitable.


Dear Commissioner Mayes
