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Re: Request for Exception to Environmental Portfolio Standard Rule Definitions (Docket No. RE-00000C-00-0377) and Expansion of the Number of Projects Allowed Under the Solar HVAC Pilot Program

Honorable Corporation Commissioners:

S.O.L.I.D. USA, Inc. (SOLID) wishes to offer its support of Staff's recommendations on the above referenced matter.

We also request at this time that the Commission consider expanding the number of projects allowed under the Solar HVAC Pilot Program from its current level of five projects to a total of fifteen projects.

Currently one solar HVAC project has been completed and one is substantially complete. Reservations have been filed under the APS CPP for three additional projects which may leave no additional opportunities to contract for solar HVAC installations at this time. SOLID has several additional customers that have indicated a strong interest in installing a solar HVAC system provided the incentives under the APS CPP are available. In addition, SOLID has been in contact with several other vendors of solar HVAC systems including IST and Berquam Engineering that have systems installed in Arizona and would like to continue their efforts to market in Arizona.

SOLID is concerned that the momentum generated by the Commissions' support of the Pilot Program could be lost if the industry was forced to wait until rules were in place under the REST to resume its efforts to promote solar HVAC in the State. Without an expansion of the Pilot Program at this time the industry may be forced to lay-off employees and delay or abandon its efforts to continue to build the infrastructure necessary to help insure that Arizona benefits from this renewable energy source and has an opportunity to become a world leader in solar HVAC.

Thank you for your continued support of solar thermal applications as one technology that will assist Arizona in meeting its renewable energy goals.
