PROCEDURAL ORDER 3

BY THE COMMISSION:

On January 29, 2001, the Securities Division ("Division") of the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") filed a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing Regarding Proposed Order to Cease and Desist, for Restitution, for Administrative Penalties, and for Other Affirmative Action ("Notice") against William E. Bergh, individually and d/b/a National Financial Group and World Wide Business Opportunities, LLC (collectively the "Respondents") in which the Division alleged that Respondents have engaged in acts, practices, and transactions that constitute violations of the Arizona Securities Act ("Act").

On February 8, 2001, Respondents William E. Bergh, individually and d/b/a National Financial Group and World Wide Business Opportunities, LLC, through counsel filed a request for hearing.

On March 26, 2001, the pre-hearing was held as scheduled. Respondents were represented by counsel. The Division also appeared with counsel. Following discussions between the parties, it was agreed that a hearing should be scheduled for May 30, 2001. In the interim, the parties agreed to attempt to resolve the issues raised by the Notice.

On March 29, 2001, the Commission issued a procedural order that set a hearing date for May

1 30, 2001.

2 On May 29, 2001, the Division filed a motion to continue the hearing. The motion stated that
3 the parties needed additional time to attempt to finalize settlement negotiations. The motion
4 indicated that all parties agreed to continue the matter.

5 The Commission finds that a continuance is in the interests of justice; that it is not intended to
6 delay the proceedings; that all parties have agreed to the continuance; and that all applicable time
7 limits are waived in this matter. Accordingly, the hearing should be rescheduled.

8 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the hearing on the above-captioned matter shall be
9 continued until August 2, 2001, at 9:30 a.m., at the Commission's offices, 1200 West Washington
10 Street, Phoenix, Arizona.

11 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the parties shall also set aside August 3, 2001 for an
12 additional day of hearing, if necessary.

13 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the parties shall exchange witness lists and exhibits not
14 later than 10 days before the hearing and provide a copy of same to the presiding Administrative Law
15 Judge, unless otherwise ordered by the Administrative Law Judge.
