16 FINDINGS OF FACT

17 1. On September 25, 2003, Verizon California, Inc. (“Verizon”) filed tariff revisions to

20 2. In the cover letter attached to the proposed tariff changes, Verizon indicated that it would

23 3. Staff has recommended that the filing be suspended for a period of ninety days.

24 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

25 1. Verizon is a public service corporation within the meaning of Article XV, Section 2, of the  
26 Arizona Constitution.

27 2. The Commission has jurisdiction over Verizon, and the subject matter of the request.

28 3. The Commission, having reviewed the filing and Staff’s Memorandum dated October 9,  
2003, concludes that it is in the public interest to suspend the filing for a period of ninety (90) days.
