First, Sempra believes that the Commission should issue an order in Docket No. E-01933A-02-0069 formally staying the conduct of further proceedings in connection with TEP's Request for Variance pending the completion of any proceedings in the instant docket in furtherance of the Commission's April 25, 2002 decision in Docket Nos. E-00000A-02-0051 and E-01345A-01-0822.

Second, Sempra agrees with TEP that any stay issued in Docket No. E-01933A-02-0069 should

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1 apply to all procedural activities and dates, including the current May 7, 2002 date for filing
2 Intervenor testimony. Finally, in the event the Commission has not rendered a final decision on the
3 transfer of generation assets and market power issues by August 1, 2002, the questions of whether
4 and how it should resume consideration of TEP's Request for Variance can be considered at that
5 time.
