**STATEMENT OF COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION
ISSUES AND PROPOSED SCHEDULE OF THE
ARIZONA COMPETITIVE POWER ALLIANCE.**

Pursuant to the Procedural Order issued May 2, 2002 in the above-captioned consolidated proceedings, the Arizona Competitive Power Alliance (the "Alliance")¹ submits this statement of

issues for consideration and proposed procedural timetable (including comment periods) for meeting the October 21, 2002 completion date for Track B, Competitive Solicitation.²

Competitive Solicitation is mandated by Commission Rule 1606(B). The Rule requires Arizona Public Service Company ("APS") and Tucson Electric Power Company ("TEP") to procure 100% of their Standard Offer Service requirements from the competitive market, through a combination of competitive bidding and arms length bilateral contracts.

I. LIST OF ISSUES

The Alliance proposes that the Commission determine the following issues in its Track B process:

1. How will an Independent Evaluator/Consultant ("IE") be selected, employed, funded and used?
 - a. How should the IE be selected? What experience and qualifications should be required of any IE?
 - b. What will the IE's duties be? How should an IE assist in:
 1. Setting Guidelines and Minimum Bid/Bilateral Contract Requirements or other competitive solicitation requirements and for "arms-length" bi-lateral contracts;
 2. Setting bid schedules;
 3. Developing, issuing, scoring and evaluating an Request for Proposal "RFP" or other competitive solicitation and "arms-length" bi-lateral contracts?
 - c. How will the IE be funded?

Inc./TECO Power Services Corporation, PG&E National Energy Group, PPL Montana, LLC, Reliant Energy, Sempra Energy Resources and Southwestern Power Group II, LLC. This pleading expresses the consensus position of the Alliance. Each individual member of the Alliance reserves the right to assert a different position.

2. What competitive solicitation processes can be used to satisfy the mandate of Rule 1606 (B) that APS and TEP acquire no less than 50% of their Standard Offer Service requirements through a competitive bid process?
 - a. What portion of the not less than 50% of their Standard Offer Service requirement should be procured through a competitive RFP process?
 - b. What portion should be procured through other forms of competitive solicitation?
3. The factors that need to be addressed in developing an optimal portfolio encouraging development of a competitive wholesale power market in Arizona to meet energy and demand obligations of the Standard Offer Load?
 - a. What are the appropriate contract duration periods?
 - b. What are the appropriate delivery dates?
 - c. How should the size of individual contracts be limited?
 - d. How should the participation of utility-owned units be conditioned?
 - e. How will the participation of affiliates of the utility be conditioned?
 - f. What will be included in Commission approved Guidelines for Competitive Solicitations and Minimum Bid/Bilateral Contract Requirements?
 - g. What characteristics of power to be bid (peak, off-peak, 5X16, 7X24, slice of system in 100 MW slices, 50% + bids of energy and/or capacity, etc.) should be established?
 - h. What is the approximate amount of baseload, intermediate, and peaking capacity that matches the utility customers' needs? How will this be established?
 - i. How will criteria for the utility to dispatch the power procured be established?
 - j. How will criteria for considering fuel source as part of the competitive solicitation be established?
 - k. How is the maximum flexibility and creative contractual alternatives to be facilitated?
4. What Transmission constraints have been identified or anticipated by the UDCs that will affect delivery of competitively procured power?
 - a. To what extent, if any, would transmission constraints affect delivery of competitively procured power?
 - b. What are the identified constraints?
 - c. How and when could the constraints be resolved?

- d. How will constraints be reflected in bid evaluation?
5. What should be included in the Guidelines for Competitive Solicitations and Minimum Bid/Bilateral Contract Requirements to facilitate the ongoing competitive process?
- a. What is the role of the UDC for power purchases and dispatch?
 - b. What is the role of affiliates of the UDC in competitive solicitation process?
 - c. What minimum participation qualifications should be established for the competitive solicitation process?
 - d. When shall deliveries commence? How should delivery dates be staggered?
 - e. How should contract terms be staggered?
 - f. What bid evaluation fees should be imposed and, if so, how, how much and by whom?
 - g. What basic solicitation information should be provided? What elements of the resource must be described in the competitive solicitation? What non-price characteristics should be specified (in-service date flexibility; dispatchability and control, reliability and level of deliverable service)?
 - h. What forms to help standardize the submission of pricing and other important proposal elements should be provided?
 - i. What price stability features will be required (fixed or fixed formula capacity prices, fixed or fixed formula energy prices, etc.)? How should escalator clauses be handled?
 - j. What reliability features will be required (capacity payments tied to availability, etc.)?
 - k. How will force majeure be defined?
 - l. What dispatchability limits will be asked for (minimum load, minimum run, ramp rate, etc.)?
 - m. What performance penalties and incentives will be required?
 - n. Should a model contract or summary of the terms and conditions that the utility desires to have in a purchase power agreement (PPA) be adopted? If so, which one(s)?
 - o. How should must-run generation be handled?
 - p. What information should be confidential and how should confidentiality be handled?

- q. Should criteria be developed for evaluating successful bids? (e.g., How will bids be scored? How will transmission availability or uncertainty be addressed? Are creditworthiness standards and associated risk premiums part of the evaluation? Will economic analysis of bids through the use of a utility simulation or production cost model be part of the evaluation? Will there be a transparent point-weighting system for non-utility bids? How will bids by as yet unsited plants be dealt with?)
- r. What portions of the Competitive Solicitation process should be specified (e.g., pre-bid meeting, notice, submittal process, screening and selection process, evaluation of selection, contracting process)?

II. PROPOSED SCHEDULE

The Alliance suggests that Track B proceed on the following schedule, which would permit completion of Track B by October 21, 2002, as required by the May 2, 2002 Procedural Order. The dates set forth below are intended to result in a competitive procurement process that complies with Electric Competition Rule 1606(B). The Alliance recognizes, however, that its proposed schedule is somewhat aggressive and that it will require all parties to work together cooperatively, and to resolve, without substantial Commission intervention, many of the issues set forth in Section I hereto. If, for whatever reason, the proposed dates prove to be overly optimistic or otherwise impracticable, the Alliance and each of its members reserve their rights to suggest modifications to any of the dates proposed.³ The most important consideration is that any competitive procurement process be well conceived, orderly and transparent. Ultimately, this consideration should determine the actual timing of the process.

Proposed Track B Schedule


III. RECOMMENDED INDEPENDENT EVALUATOR
