Greetings Commissioner Mayes,

Hope all is well with you and you are enjoying the seasons, jack ehrhardt from Kingman here.

As always, thank you for your diligent work with the applicants from Mohave County, principally Rhodes development. We who live here read about how he ran his business in Nevada and have no doubt that this zebra is not going to change his strips.

I was writing regarding a proposed power plant planned in the Yucca area near Kingman and near the Griffith gas fired power plant. The line sitting committee has a case for the addition to this plant, it is called ,Northern Arizona Energy Project, 175 M.W. But the gas energy plant I am concerned about that is in the same area is the 90 mega watt Black Mountain Generating Station. The article in our paper says it is on a fast tract and no public scoping meetings planned. So I call the A.C.C. and staff says there is no application because it is under 100 mega watts.

I am writing to express my concerns and request a review by the commission regarding this company obviously trying to slide under the 100 mega watt limit. I believe that it is close enough to the 100 mega watt size [and may indeed be 100 megs if not reviewed] that it should fall under your purview. With the issues of environmental concern regarding water use and air quality we have no other review process to protect our selves from inadvertent detrimental impacts.

Mohave County has an ordinance that states gas fired plants must use dry cooling technology when the aquifer is in question .Well this is the same aquifer that Rhodes development wants to draw from and there is no definitive known quantity of water in this water basin. With the recent Supreme Court case regarding global warming and climate change , I believe all regulatory agencies, not just E.P.A. have been tasked to pay attention to carbon emissions and carbon sink capabilities or rather lack there off. With this proposed plant being 60 miles from the Grand Canyon and having these impacts I am requesting the Commission consider my request to make this plant fall under your jurisdiction. If this was a wind energy or other renewable project that creates the same power, but no impacts I would not be making this request. Thanks for your consideration.
