INSUFFICIENCY LETTER

Dear Mr. McCormick:

This letter (per section R14-2-103.B.7 of the Arizona Administrative Code) is to inform you that your application, received on July 23, 2007, has not met the sufficiency requirements as outlined in Arizona Administrative Code R14-2-402. The deficiencies are:

1. Based on the submitted water usage data, the Company's system does not have adequate production to serve the projected five year growth in the requested area. Does the Company plan to install a new well within five years? If the answer is yes, please provide the proposed well pumping rate and construction schedule.
2. The Company operates eight wells. In the 2006 Annual Report ("AR"), the Company only reported arsenic levels in four wells (Well #1, #2, #3 and #4). Please provide information on arsenic levels in the other wells.
3. Arsenic levels in Well #1, #2 and #3 are below arsenic MCL. However, the reported arsenic and fluoride levels in Well #4 exceeds MCL. Please provide a copy of proposed water treatment plant for arsenic and fluoride removal at this wellhead. If the Company determines that no treatment is necessary, please explain.
4. The Company has indicated that Bullhead City will be providing sewer services to the three sections requested in this application. Please provide any documentary evidence in support of this assertion, especially Bullhead City's commitment to providing sewer service to the third parcel (Section 33 of T21N, R21W) located outside its city limit.
5. Please provide a copy of engineering construction plan showing how the Company will serve the requested area.

6. Please provide a copy of an itemized estimated engineering cost for this proposed CC&N extension.
7. Please provide a copy of ADWR's analysis of Adequate Water Supply, or, in the alternative, the status of the appropriate application.

Staff would like to use this opportunity to bring the following to your attention:

- Pursuant to the Arizona Administrative Code ("A.A.C.") R-14-2-411(C), upon meeting sufficiency requirements, the Commission has 150 calendar days for its substantive review. This includes conducting a hearing and preparing Opinion and Order to present to the Commission at an Open Meeting; and
- Pursuant to A.A.C. R14-2-411(C)(3), Staff may terminate an application if the applicant does not remedy all deficiencies within 60 calendar days of the notice of deficiency.
