Mr. Hardcastle,

I would like to tell you of a conversation I had this evening with John Breninger.

When I arrived home this evening Mr. Breninger had left a message on my answering machine at 5PM, so I called him back it was about 630PM. John asked for my permission to conduct a survey tomorrow morning on the east to west running easement, that runs through my property, which provides access to the J1 well. I informed him that I do not own the easement and he should contact the Johnson's who retain ownership of said easement. I also informed him that I currently have a trailer that I believe is blocking the 12 foot easement that he was referring to.

Furthermore because of the, unacceptably, late notice he was giving me that I would not be able to remove the trailer which would make it impossible to conduct an survey without leaving the easement and walking on my property. I made it quite clear that I do not want him or anyone else on my property while I am not present and that I would not be able to be present due to my work schedule. He stated that he understood that I could not be present and that even though I told him not to be on my property that HE IS GOING TO DO IT ANYWAY.

This is a totally unacceptable situation! He is going to trespass on my property with a crew of surveyors against my wishes.

If he had provided me with more then a few hours of notice I could have moved the trailer and this would be a non issue.

Sir I will surmise my position. I do not want anyone on my property while I am not here. I have many horses and if someone where to be injured I could be liable. Anyone who is on my property tomorrow is going to be trespassing.
