CONTINUANCE OF TEMPORARY
STAY OF PROCEEDINGS

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On August 1, 2007, Perkins Mountain Water Company and Perkins Mountain Utility Company ("Applicants") filed a Motion for Reconsideration, or in the alternative, Motion for Temporary Stay of Proceedings. At the Procedural Conference held on August 3, 2007, Applicants requested a temporary stay of 90 to 120 days for the purpose of exploring other options for the provision of water and wastewater services to two master planned developments in Mohave County known as Golden Valley South and The Villages at White Hills ("Developments"). At the procedural conference, counsel for Applicants stated that:

We could seek out an existing certificated utility company in the State of Arizona that could serve these projects. We could look to the county to talk about formation of a district, a community facilities district or a domestic water improvement and wastewater improvement district. Municipal service is also a possibility that's out there.

At the conclusion of the Procedural Conference, the Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") granted a 90-day stay of the proceedings and ordered that by November 2, 2007,


1 Applicants "submit a pleading that describes where things are and whether [Applicants]
2 intend to pursue these applications."²

3 Since the Procedural Conference, Applicants have had numerous substantive and
4 productive discussions on multiple fronts regarding water and wastewater service for the
5 Developments. Applicants are working to finalize an alternative plan which will be
6 presented to the Commission. However, Applicants will need a short additional period
7 of time to complete this work.

8 Consistent with Applicants' original request for a temporary stay of 90 to 120
9 days, Applicants request a 30-day extension of the temporary stay through and including
10 December 3, 2007 in order to complete its alternative plan.
