
BNA Answers:

As an initial matter, BNA notes that ACC staff has not precisely defined the term "PPA" in this data request and, therefore, BNA is unsure of the meaning and scope of the term. Notwithstanding the uncertainty surrounding the definition of PPA, Broadweave notes that it does not intend to enter into any agreements that would legally or contractually preclude any service provider from installing infrastructure equipment, offering services, or otherwise competing for any Broadweave customers. Broadweave does plan to enter into agreements with developers and home owners associations so that these developers and home owners associations can offer advanced telecommunication services to their residents and members.
