Mr. Sundlof characterized his April 29, 2008 letter to you with regard to the above-referenced matter as "a bit out of the ordinary," and that same characterization might apply to this letter as well, inasmuch as you have not as yet acted upon Pinal County's April 8, 2008 Application for Leave to Intervene in the contemplated limited re-opening of Siting Case No. 126. However, for the same time constraint reasons referenced in Mr. Sundlof's aforesaid letter to you, I am communicating directly with you at this time with regard to two (2) matters.

First, with the exception of the May 30, 2008 hearing date suggested by Mr. Sundlof in his April 29, 2008 letter to you, the procedural schedule suggested by the Salt River Project Agricultural Improvement and Power District ("SRP") is acceptable to Pinal County. Pinal County's contemplated witness for the hearing will be unavailable on May 29 and 30, 2008, and accordingly we suggest that the hearing be scheduled for June 3 or 4, 2008.

Second, and with reference to the form of notice for the Public Open House referred to in Mr. Sundlof's letter, attached is a copy of the form of letter which Pinal County has authorized me to transmit to you for your consideration. As you will note, the letter would originate from Pinal County and be signed by a Pinal County representative, which we understand to be the desire of several members of the Commission from comments that were made at the April 24, 2008 Open Meeting. In that regard, Pinal County anticipates that it will coordinate with SRP in

Dear Homeowner/Landowner:

On April 4, 2008 the Salt River Agricultural Improvement and Power District ("SRP") filed a motion with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("ACC") requesting that the ACC amend a 2005 ACC decision for the limited purpose of widening an electric transmission line corridor which the ACC previously approved for SRP. The current corridor width is 1,000 feet, and SRP has requested that it be widened to 3,140 feet. The proposed widening would occur in the area indicated on the map attached as Appendix "A." In an April 8, 2008 filing with the ACC, Pinal County indicated its support for the corridor widening proposed by SRP. On April 24, 2008, the ACC agreed to consider SRP's request and instructed its Hearing Division to schedule a public hearing for that purpose.

Pinal County supports SRP's request, because it would enable SRP to design and locate its Pinal West – Southeast Valley/Browning 500/230 kV transmission line so as to avoid crossing the Pinal County Fairgrounds. Under the corridor width currently approved for SRP, the new electric transmission line would be constructed through the middle of the Fairgrounds (in a West to East direction), and would substantially and adversely impact many of the activities which occur on the Fairgrounds throughout the year, and the thousands of Pinal County residents and visitors who attend and participate in those activities. This potential impact is illustrated by Appendix "B," which shows (i) SRP's current 1,000 feet corridor in blue, (ii) the areas of the Fairgrounds used for various activities in yellow, and (iii) photographs of typical attendance at such activities.

Arizona Public Service Company ("APS") recently received authorization from the ACC to construct its Sundance – Pinal South 230 kV transmission line in the same area as SRP's proposed corridor widening. It is possible that APS' and SRP's lines would be located parallel to one another somewhere between the southern boundary of the Fairgrounds and Earley Road. The precise location in that area may be influenced by public comments received by the ACC, APS and SRP.

Attached as Appendix "C" is a simulation of how the two (2) lines would appear, as viewed from south of Earley Road, if they were located adjacent to Earley Road. Attached as Appendix "D" is a simulation of how the lines would appear from the same viewpoint, if located in the area immediately south of the Fairgrounds, which is the alignment preferred by Pinal County.

On behalf of Pinal County, I would like to invite you to a public Open House which will be held at the Pinal County Fairgrounds on May __, 2008. At that time you can learn more about the proposed corridor widening and share your views. In addition, there will be a public evidentiary hearing before the ACC on _____, 2008, at 1200 West Washington, Phoenix, Arizona.
