

## FINDING OF THE TRUE FACTS

1. Prior to July 14<sup>th</sup>, 2003 when Gringo Pass Inc. filed for this application they were told that this was the only way to do it and requested by the Corporation Commission to do it like we did.
2. After being here over forty years and seeing the pay phones come and go I was determined to have pay phones that would stay and be permanent as a convenience for the public.
3. At one time there were ten pay phones on the Government property at the port of entry, where the Port Director gave authority to do so, but once the people started going all over the government property to use the phone, restrooms, visit, and park their vehicles the General Service Administration forced their removal.
4. When the last pay phone company was granted a five year lease under the condition they would pay half of whatever the coin boxes took in to help cover electricity, insurance, maintenance and repairs and etc. This worked pretty good for about a year. In fact sometimes the coin boxes would fill up so fast that AT & T even gave the key to us so we could empty the coin boxes.
5. Gringo Pass Inc. owns all of the private property in Lukeville, a million and a half to two million people go through here and there are no pay telephones to service them nor will there be any unless they are on Gringo Pass property.
6. It is not in the public interest to deny the public pay telephones for failure to put up some type of placard identifying the service, it's foolish until after you have the pay telephones and certificate.
7. Gringo Pass Inc. is a small company and can not drive back and forth (300 miles) to Phoenix, have coffee and lunch with the Staff and put forth all the pros and cons and this is the last shot to try for pay telephones for the public.
