SECOND INSUFFICIENCY LETTER

Gentlemen:

In reference to the above-mentioned application filed on April 8, 2008, this letter is to inform you that the application has not met sufficiency requirements under the Arizona Administrative Code ("A.A.C."). The following information needs to be provided in order to determine sufficiency:

1. Our records indicate that the Company has not filed the **Utilities Division Annual Reports** for 2001, 2002, 2003, and 2004. In fact, the Company's CC&N was initially revoked for failure to file the 2001 Annual Report in Decision No. 65649 issued February 1, 2003. Please file the delinquent reports and provide an explanation as to why the Company failed to comply with A.A.C. 14-2-411(D) (4).

After receipt of the Company's response to the Insufficiency Letter, I placed a call to Diana Crites, Property Manager for Company, and advised her that the above-referenced reports had not been filed with the Utilities Division. I further clarified with her that the annual reports the Company had made current was with the Corporations Division and not the Utilities Division. She said that she would check on the matter and advise me of the status. As of this date, I have not heard from anyone from the Company, and the above-referenced annual reports have not been filed.

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Staff would like to use this opportunity to bring the following to your attention:

- Pursuant to the A.A.C. R-14-2-411(C), upon meeting sufficiency requirements, the Commission has 150 days for its substantive review. This includes conducting a hearing and preparing an Opinion and Order to present to the Commission at an Open Meeting; and
- Pursuant to A.A.C. R14-2-411(C) (3), Staff may terminate an application if the applicant does not remedy all deficiencies within 60 calendar days of the notice of deficiency.
