Sulphur Springs Valley Co-op is trying to run a 69 kv transmission line thru our community. The large power poles will destroy the prestige landscape. This area is some of the last beautiful landscape left in Arizona. They indicate this power is not to service our area.

There are many many unanswered questions from different people in the community. These questions need to be answered.

Some of these questions are: who is all of this power going to? (69 kv is much more that is needed for this community.)

They are proposing to run this new transmission line thru area that do not have lines at this time. (Thus destroying that beautiful Country!)

Why can't the new line be run in conjunction with existing lines?

It appears some of these lines will run directly over some homes. Thus decreasing home value. The homeowner needs to be compensated for their loss.

Since Sulphur Springs Valley Electric Co-op is suppose to be a co-op, there appears to be only a small group making all decisions. The members are not voting on issues that affect the co-op.
