Clarification of Net Metering Rules

Explanation: As a resident of Pinal County I have reviewed the proposed Net Metering Rules in connection with a decision I will be making shortly on whether to add a 4.6 kWh solar electric-generating facility to my home. This facility is expected to produce excess electricity in March, April, May and October which would be contributed to the local electrical grid. As such it is important to my investment decision to know that the excess kWh that I produce would be fully credited against the power I purchase from my Electric Utility. R14-2-23906 D clearly states "If the electricity generated by the Net Metering Customer exceeds the electricity supplied by the Electric Utility in a billing period, the Customer shall be credited during the next billing period for the excess kWh generated."

The above statement is clear as to the "Excess" carryover netting in the subsequent month but is not clear as to what happens if the "credit carryover" again generates a "net credit". The rules should make it clear that unused "Excess" carries forward until used or year end.


Requested Clarification: The rules would be clearer if an "s" was added to the last word of the last sentence of R14-2-23906 D. Example: "...the Electric Utility customer during the following billing periods". The final word of the subsection would become "periods".

Benefit: This small change would greatly assist readers in understanding that "Excess kWh" can be utilized thru year end.
