Re: Request for procedural conference

At the hearing on September 14<sup>th</sup> the Transmission Line Siting Committee chaired by Mr. Paul Bullis granted our request as individual intervenors (loosely formulated under the name COST,) and other individuals to be heard in regard to protecting the environment in which we and our families live. We, the (intervenors) are prepared to testify as to why no permit should be granted for the proposed expansion of the San Tan (SRP) Electric Company located at Warner and Val Vista Road in Gilbert, Arizona.

To impede our rights to be heard, and to withhold the information we have researched regarding the dangers to the environment, should the SRP expansion permit be granted, would be a grave injustice to all those living in Gilbert, the East Valley as well as the Transmission Line Siting Committee. It will also be a disservice to each and every individual who has gone through the time and personal expense to be an intervenor.

To continue to insist that the fourteen individual intervenors be consolidated into one presentation by one person severely limits the rights of free speech to those who have already been granted that right.

We are working individuals who must do research and compile materials outside of our work time without financial compensation. We each focus on only a few portions of this vast topic. It is imperative we each be given an opportunity to present our information, research, and cross-examine witnesses that focus on our part of the intervention.

To continue to try to reduce the number of intervenors has become repetitive. It could have been avoided if Mr. Bullis's initial decision to have each intervenor speak was respected.

The newly added procedural conference has become another burden of time for all concerned.

2. In regard to SRP's request to withdraw its testimony on the polling and survey efforts of The Summit Group — **Definitely not.** This is part of the record and definitely needs to remain so. It is an important part of this proceedings which one of the intervenors will prove. Our time was spent listening to this presentation, seeing the exhibits and cross-examining the witness. It must remain. To blatantly struck this data from the record under the present circumstances would appear to be hiding something. If the media learns of this, it would lead to a "feeding frenzie".
3. It is my belief that the Line Siting Committee has a great deal of responsibility in their position and their decisions. The future health, safety and financial well-being of homeowners, their families and the entire community of Gilbert, Arizona as well as the East Valley could be at stake and tied to their decision. It is imperative that extensive discovery material be made available to the members of the Line Siting Committee, and to all intervenors so everyone is completely informed without any other undue influence.
4. SRP can ask their customers for their consent to release records of communication. The data requested is necessary for the presentation of an intervenor and should not be withheld. *(As a customer of SRP, I would have no problem in granting a consent to release my records of communications under these circumstances).*
5. I would agree to additional hearing dates, to hear all parties and to have all cross-examinations implemented, if necessary. Gilbert Arizona and the East Valley will be growing and here for a long time. It is necessary to give each and every person who will reside in this community the best possible environment in which to live. It is also necessary to give each intervenor the right to be heard.

I believe it is my responsibility to give this very important issue my time and full attention. I also believe the Transmission Line Siting Committee, The Arizona Corporation Commission, SRP and all those involved would want to do the same.
