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
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


We live within 1 mile from the proposed San Tan Power Plant.

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





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Dear Commissioner Irvin,

I attended the majority of the 20 days of hearings conducted by the Power Plant and Line Siting Committee regarding the Santan Expansion Project. First I would like to commend the members of that committee for their patience and attentiveness to the concerns of the Intervenors in that matter. They gave them every opportunity to express their concerns, and in the process developed 34 conditions, which directly address the concerns of those protesting the expansion.

I attended those hearings as a supporter of the expansion, and nothing I heard during the nearly 1500 hours of testimony has led me to have doubts about the appropriateness of the decision rendered by that committee.

I would like to add some comments, which I feel are pertinent in support of the project.

1. When the original plant was built in the early 1970s, the population of Gilbert was barely more than 2,000 residents.
2. The commercial and industrial square footage at that time was probably less than 50,000 square feet. The majority of the population engaged in farming activities.
3. The population in 2000 has reached over 100,000 residents and the majority of those residents are no longer involved in agriculture.
4. The commercial and industrial square footage in the Town of Gilbert is now over 9,000,000 square feet with much more on the drawing boards. Most of the additional commercial and industrial use also will require much more in the way of electricity per square foot than was used by comparison in the 1970s.
5. Many of those 100,000 residents are supported by jobs in the surrounding communities -. Chandler and Mesa in addition to those employed locally.
6. If the only place that new power generation is permitted is in outlying areas, will this not further impact not only the quality of family life by requiring longer commutes and more time away from their children, but also create greater pollution from the additional traffic and congestion?

In conclusion, I would make the point that in Tempe, a city that is landlocked and where growth is virtually at a standstill, this Commission wisely sited the additional power unit at Kyrene to assure those residents and commercial interests of a reliable and stable electrical supply. Can the Commission do any less for the citizens of Gilbert where growth will continue unabated for many years?
