





Unable to attend the scheduled meeting regarding the change in the area code, I would like you to consider these thoughts during your discussion:

1. When you look at the upcoming area code changes, I would like to see that the majority of the state keeps the area code 520.
2. The first time you made the change from 602, you changed the rest of the state to 520 and left the Phoenix area at 602. But within a relatively short time that area was again divided into the three current area codes of 623, 480 and 602.
3. Since the areas with the most population growth are causing a need for different area codes in the first place, please consider changing those areas and leave the smaller outlying areas with the 520.
4. Consider PLANNING AHEAD! Instead of just adding one area code to the areas with the most growth, see about initially dividing that area into three, possibly four new area codes. There are many costs and revenue losses to small businesses associated with area code changes that preplanning could prevent. Example: If Tucson has a huge requirement for new numbers, divide that area into 3 or 4 sections by projected growth and assign those areas all new area codes. At the same time leave all of the other outlying areas 520. Then as the Tucson area grows these next 10 years, the area codes are in place to handle the number of new lines needed.

On the flip side of the scale to do an overlay area code system can work. I have done business and have several friends in the Denver area... they have had two area codes working in an overlay system for several years. It does require dialing 10 digits with each phone call in the area, but they were happier to not have to change their area code. I am not as much in favor of this system, but do know that it works.

Dear Secretary,


I am asking for an "overlay" resolution to the problem of filling out area code 520.
