**ADDENDUM TO THE PETITION OF THE
NORTH AMERICAN NUMBERING PLAN ADMINISTRATOR
ON BEHALF OF THE ARIZONA TELECOMMUNICATIONS INDUSTRY**

The North American Numbering Plan Administrator NeuStar, Inc. (formerly Lockheed Martin IMS)¹ ("NANPA"), in its role as the neutral third party NPA Relief Planner for Arizona under the North American Numbering Plan ("NANP") and on behalf of the Arizona telecommunications industry ("Industry"),² hereby files this Addendum to its petition filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") on November 8, 1999 in the above-captioned proceeding to notify the Commission of the Industry's consensus decision to recommend an all-services distributed overlay as the method of relief for the 520 Numbering Plan Area ("NPA").³

¹ The North American Numbering Plan Administration and other numbering functions have been transferred from Lockheed Martin IMS to NeuStar, Inc. The Federal Communications Commission approved the transfer on November 17, 1999. *Request of Lockheed Martin Corporation and Warburg, Pincus & Co. for Review of the Transfer of the Lockheed Martin Communications Industry Services Business*, Order, FCC 99-346 (Nov. 17, 1999). The transaction closed on November 30, 1999.

² The Industry is composed of telecommunications carriers operating in or considering operations within the state of Arizona.

³ As the neutral third party administrator, NANPA has no independent view regarding the relief option selected by the Industry.

I. BACKGROUND

The 1999 Central Office Code Utilization Survey ("COCUS") projections for central office ("CO") code utilization indicate that the 520 NPA will exhaust during the fourth quarter of 2001. Based upon this projection, NANPA notified the Industry and the Commission that NPA relief planning for the 520 NPA needed to be addressed. NANPA facilitated two Industry meetings, the first on September 8, 1999 in Phoenix, Arizona, and the second by conference call on September 27, 1999, to discuss relief alternatives for the 520 NPA. The Industry, however, was unable to reach consensus to recommend a single relief alternative to the Commission as the preferred form of relief for the 520 NPA. On November 8, 1999, NANPA, at the Industry's direction, filed a petition with the Commission to request approval of one of two Industry proposed relief plans, a geographic split (referred to as Alternative #2 in the original petition) or an all-services distributed overlay (referred to as Alternative #3 in the original petition) for the 520 NPA. Pursuant to the Commission staff's request, NANPA conducted a third Industry meeting on April 19, 2000 in an effort to provide the Industry with the opportunity to reach consensus to recommend a single relief plan to the Commission. After discussing the two relief plans, the Industry reached consensus to recommend to the Commission Alternative #3, an all-services distributed overlay as the preferred means of relief for the 520 NPA.

II. DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED ALL-SERVICES DISTRIBUTED OVERLAY RELIEF PLAN


The all-services distributed overlay relief plan would overlay a new area code over the same geographic area covered by the existing 520 NPA. All existing customers would retain their existing 520 area code and would not be required to change their

telephone numbers. Consistent with Federal Communications Commission regulations, ten-digit local dialing would be implemented for calls placed within and between the 520 NPA and the new relief NPA. When the 520 NPA is exhausted of its supply of CO codes, all CO code assignments for the 520 NPA will be made in the new overlay NPA.

III. CONCLUSION

NANPA, on behalf of the Industry, presents this Addendum and requests that the Commission approve the Industry's recommendation to implement an all-services distributed overlay as the means of relief for the 520 NPA. The Industry will begin implementing NPA relief once the Commission has issued a final order approving the petition.

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
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
