I have a vested interest in the city of Scottsdale. Since I live and work in the city, I am concerned with the infrastructure development. As a real estate agent, it is crucial that I understand the aspects and advantages of various communities in Scottsdale.

On Tuesday evening, April 7th, at the Scottsdale City Council meeting I understand the Council voted to intercede in the hearing with NewPath Networks, LLC, at the Arizona Corporation Commission.

From what I have heard, there has been a very minimal outcry against the cell phone network improvements NewPath has put forth. As a real estate agent, I witness first hand the importance potential buyers place on cell phone coverage. Every time I host an open house for a client, one of the first things people do when they enter the property is check their level of coverage.

The proprietary cell phone structures that NewPath has created will greatly enhance the cell phone coverage in Scottsdale, specifically in the northern part of the city. I know NewPath is in the process of reaching out to the communities where they have proposed implementation of the project in order to generate support for the project. I have seen developers, in the past, simply give lip service to neighborhoods and the outlying areas of their project, but NewPath appears to be legitimately working with the community.

Scottsdale City Council and the Arizona Corporation Commission should grant NewPath Networks their requested CC&N and allow them to move forward with their improvements. Scottsdale and its residents will greatly benefit from the improvements and I for one would appreciate greater cell phone coverage.

Dear Commissioners,


I am a member of the Scottsdale community and maintain a great interest in local development activities due to my residency and line of work. As a real estate agent, I understand fully the difficulties felt in the Northeast region of Scottsdale regarding cell phone service. It is not uncommon for there to be little or no cell phone coverage in much of that area - This has been an overarching concern for neighborhood participants ranging from long-time residents to prospective home buyers.

It is for that reason that I am reaching out to the ACC and Scottsdale City Council in support of the NewPath Network's project proposal in Scottsdale. When the organization initially approached the city of Scottsdale concerning the pursuit of this project, many in the community were skeptical. I am a long-time resident of Scottsdale and I am contacting the Commission because I am privy to some of the recent community activities with which I do not agree. I believe that the city of Scottsdale is one of the best places to live in the state, providing a great sense of community, appreciation for life, successful industry, and an unmatched landscape. While Scottsdale is an unbeatable place to call home, it is not without its drawbacks. One of the long-stemming challenges has to do with poor cell phone and network quality in some parts of the city. As a resident, there is nothing more frustrating than not being able to stay connected from your own home.


That is why I was so excited to hear that the company, NewPath Networks, had a solution to the community's poor cell phone connection issues. It is my understanding, however, that a few others with vested interests did not share my sentiment. There have been some that voiced concern regarding the effect of the company implementing cell phone relays in the area. Some people felt there would be adverse safety impacts and others simply did not want to sacrifice the value of the natural landscape that we had so-long appreciated.

Recently, NewPath Networks addressed the community concerns and debunked much of the unsubstantiated concern. They provided research indicating the safety of local neighborhoods would not be at risk and worked directly with the residents, presenting us with the various facades used for their cell phone relays which blend right into the local landscape and area. Many of the previous skeptics, after understanding the huge decrease in daily frustrations NewPath's service would bring, changed their tune in support of the company.

However, I was recently informed that the Scottsdale City Council, as well as the Corporation Commission, have been approached in regards to stopping NewPath Networks from proceeding with their project. I was shocked to hear this and thought to contact the Commission in support of NewPath. I do not want the community to miss a great opportunity because a small number of residents, still unaware of the benefits, spoke on behalf of the entire neighborhood. I urge the Commission and Council to adequately understand the efforts of NewPath Networks and further allow the company to continue their pursuit in providing a beneficial service to our neighborhoods.
