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“Draft” Questions for Discussion by the Energy Efficiency Technical Working  
Group – 4/1/09

Assuming an energy efficiency goal of at least 20% of the total energy resources needed to meet retail load in 2020:

1. What should the annual percentage be and on what schedule?
2. What are the estimated annual costs of achieving this goal?
3. What would be an estimate of the annual savings, in dollars, of achieving this goal?
4. How and to what extent can energy efficiency help to relieve system constraints?
5. What is an adequate level of funding?
6. What are the best methods for cost recovery?
7. What would be the bill impact to customers of achieving this goal?
8. What waivers may be necessary for unexpected circumstances?
9. What would be the revenue concerns, quantified, for utilities?
10. What are the methods that should be used to address the revenue concerns of utilities?
