**ORDER EXTENDING TIME  
DEADLINE CONTAINED IN  
DECISION NO. 70352**

Having considered the entire record herein and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission finds, concludes, and orders that:

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. On July 23, 2007, Double Diamond Utilities, Inc. ("DDU" or "Double Diamond") filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") an application for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("CC&N") to provide water and wastewater services for a master planned community known as The Ranch at White Hills ("White Hills") in Mohave County, Arizona.

2. On May 16, 2008, the Commission issued Decision No. 70352, which approved DDU's application for CC&Ns to provide water and wastewater services to White Hills. Decision No. 70352 required DDU, among other things, to file by December 31, 2008, a performance bond or irrevocable sight draft letter of credit in the amount of \$500,000 for its water and wastewater CC&Ns, and to retain a Certified Operator at least six months before it serves its first customer or by June 30, 2009, whichever occurred first.

1           3.       On December 17, 2008, DDU filed a Motion for Extension of Compliance Dates  
2 (“Motion”) to file the performance bond or irrevocable sight draft letter of credit and retain a  
3 Certified Operator; DDU’s Motion states DDU has complied with all requirements to date, which  
4 includes filing its rate tariff, curtailment tariff, backflow prevention tariff, and Water Conservation  
5 Plan. The Motion further states that due to a downturn in the economy the finance and credit markets  
6 have tightened, which has delayed development at White Hills. DDU’s Motion further requests that  
7 DDU be allowed to file the performance bond or irrevocable sight draft letter of credit at least 15  
8 days prior to providing water and wastewater utility service to any customers.

9           4.       Regarding the extension of time to retain a Certified Operator, DDU’s Motion states  
10 that due to the downturn in the market, the June 30, 2009, compliance date is premature as  
11 development has been delayed. DDU request that the compliance deadline to obtain a Certified  
12 Operator be extended to six months before it serves its first customer.

13           5.       On January 30, 2009, Staff filed a Memorandum in response to DDU’s Motion  
14 (“Response”). According to the Response, Staff is uncomfortable with DDU’s request for an open  
15 ended extension of time to comply. Therefore, Staff recommends granting DDU an extension of time  
16 to file its performance bond or irrevocable sight draft letter of credit, until 30 days prior to serving its  
17 first customer or by December 31, 2011, whichever comes first.

18           6.       Staff further recommends that DDU obtain a Certified Operator at least six months  
19 before it serves its first customer or December 31, 2011, whichever comes first.

20           7.       Staff’s Response states that although the economy has put a damper on much of the  
21 development in the State, Staff continues to be concerned with development projects being  
22 indefinitely put on hold or never taking place. Staff reasoned that in setting deadlines in requests for  
23 extension of time to comply, the Commission is given an opportunity to re-evaluate the progress  
24 being made in the proposed development.

25           8.       DDU’s Motion states the developers fully intend to continue with the development at  
26 White Hills.

27           9.       Staff’s recommendations are reasonable and should be adopted.

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CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

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2 1. Double Diamond is a public service corporation within the meaning of Article XV of  
3 the Arizona Constitution and A.R.S. §§40-281 and 40-282.

4 2. The Commission has jurisdiction over Double Diamond and the subject matter to  
5 extend the time for compliance as set forth in Commission Decision No. 70352.

6 3. Staff's recommendation that Double Diamond should receive an extension of time to  
7 comply with Decision No. 70352, is reasonable and should be adopted.

8 ORDER

9 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Double Diamond Utilities, Inc., is hereby granted an  
10 extension of time, until 30 days prior to serving its first customer or by December 31, 2011,  
11 whichever comes first, to procure and file proof of a performance bond or irrevocable sight draft  
12 letter of credit in the amount of \$500,000, as set forth in Commission Decision No. 70352.

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1 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Double Diamond Utilities, Inc., is hereby granted an  
2 extension of time, until six months before it serves its first customer or by December 31, 2011,  
3 whichever comes first, to retain a Certified Operator for its water and wastewater systems, as set forth  
4 in Commission Decision No. 70352.

5 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Decision shall become effective immediately.




