**NOTICE OF COMPLIANCE
WITH DECISION NO. 68742**

Balterra Sewer Corp. ("Balterra") submits this Notice of Compliance pursuant to Decision No. 68742 (June 5, 2006). Decision No. 68742 requires Balterra to provide the Commission within one year of the effective date of this order a detailed report describing the Company's progress toward working with the water company for the requested area, Water Utility of Greater Tonopah, to increase the use of effluent specifically as it pertains to golf courses, ornamental lakes or other aesthetic water features. These annual reports continue until the Company's next general rate case.

Global Water Resources acquired Balterra Sewer Corp in a transaction that was approved by the Commission in May 2008. Global Water Resources also owns the Water Utility of Greater Buckeye which has been granted the certificate of convenience and necessity (CC&N) for water service in the Balterra Sewer Corp. sewer CC&N.

The acquisition of Balterra Sewer Corp has allowed for the extension of Total Water Management into the region. In conjunction with the Hassayampa Utility Company (also owned by Global Water Resources) and WUGT, Global has consolidated the water resources management in the areas west of the Hassayampa River. As the Commission is aware, the groundwater resources in the Hassayampa Sub-Basin cannot support the desired development directly, and it is only through the use of Designations of Assured Water Supply (versus

2 by recharge, that development on the scale desired by the land-owners can occur.
