

**We Object!!!**

1. We already have underground service to our home from the existing power pole and street light (which will not eliminate the service pole in our driveway). Our property is one of the highest estimates charged and we have the least amount of work to be done.
2. Approximately 1/5 to 1/2 of our property is a very steep slope down to the U.S. FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE'S BILL WILLIAMS WILDLIFE REFUGE. You want to assess our property by the square foot, is this fair; considering our telephone and electrical usage?
3. In a few more years the utilities would have to replace the poles anyway; so why is it going to be at our expense and without customer service upgrades like Verizon high speed internet, television and telephone service. For the amount of money that I'm going to pay all I get is a replacement pole with a street light on it!!! If I'm really lucky my approximately 24 feet of electrical conduit going up the side of the pole and with the telephone cable going down the side of the pole going underground will just be left on the existing pole and the street lamp will be out for another year or two.
4. When the utilities are placed underground and the nice 2 to 3 inch cap of asphalt is placed over the new service trench. Who is going to fix the old broken 1/2 asphalt caused by excavators and other construction equipment? Our roads are so thin and broken up now that La Paz County has quit sweeping our streets here at Hillcrest Bay Estates least they sweep up more loose pieces of asphalt and leave us a dirt road.
5. Here come the MONSOON rains and Hillcrest Drive is very steep incline and who is going to pay for the MUDDY FLASH FLOOD DAMAGE on the homes located at the curve at the bottom of the hill. If the culvert that goes under AZ 95 gets plugged up due to excessive run off from the Hillcrest Bay

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Estates; WHO PAYS FOR THE REPAIRS??? The State of Arizona (budget shortfall) or the Association here at Hillcrest Bay? Who pays for the silt removal from the federal reservoir? Has the ENVIROMENTAL IMPACT REPORTS been compiled and submitted to the various Federal, State and Special Districts for approval?

6. We are full time residents and the people that are pushing to have the utilities placed underground DO NOT LIVE HERE full time and WONT have to deal with construction ie: closed roads, trenches, barricades etc.

What will happen when Emergency Services can't get in the one and only access road into the neighborhood?

On the evening of July 22, 2005 my husband David died on the living room floor. My oldest son and a very dear friend did CPR until the Paramedics arrived. David was transported to the Arizona Heart Hospital in Phoenix, AZ where he slept for seven (7) weeks until he was well enough to come home. David is a diabetic and had several strokes, legally blind, and now his kidneys are failing. I had to fight the Association to put in a accessibility concrete ramp so my husband could get into our home. The Association says they are going to help the low income; yet they have no money to do so and even IF they helped us we would still have a bill of approximately \$15,000.00. WE ARE ON A FIXED INCOME AND THE MEDICAL BILLS ARE EXTREMELY HIGH!!!

In a few more years the Power company will come in and replace the poles at there expense!!! We will still have a service pole because the neighborhood street light is on it.
