Dynegy Arlington Valley, LLC (formerly LSP Arlington Valley, LLC post being Duke Energy Arlington Valley, LLC "Duke") submits this self-certification letter for calendar year 2007 as required by A.C.C. Decision 62995. As required by the A.C.C., copies of this letter are being submitted to the Arizona Attorney General and the directors of the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality, Department of Water Resources and Department of Commerce Energy Office.

AVEF's compliance with respect to the 14 conditions contained in its Certificate of Environmental Compatibility (A.C.C. Decision No: 62995) is as follows:

1. AVEF is in compliance with all existing applicable air and water pollution control standards and regulations and with all existing applicable ordinances, master plans and regulations of the State of Arizona, the County of Maricopa, the United States and any other governmental entity having jurisdiction.
2. AVEF was constructed within the five year term of the CEC. The facility was online and in commercial operation in June 2002.
3. As noted at the CEC hearing, AVEF has satisfied this condition because its switchyard is the Hassayampa Switchyard.
4. As contemplated in the CEC Order, condition #4 is satisfied because AVEF has met its construction and operational deadlines.
5. Applicant submitted its interconnection agreement to the ACC on May 2, 2002.
6. LS Power Generation, LLC owns 100% of the membership interest in LSP Arlington Valley, LLC and is complying with all WECC requirements. An LSP affiliate is a member of the Western Electric Coordinating Council (WECC).
7. AVEF is a member of the Southwest Reserve Sharing Group. A copy of the FERC order accepting AVEF's membership effective February 4, 2003, was attached to our self certification letter to you dated July 30, 2003, filed in Line Siting Case 117 (A.C.C. Decision No. 64717).
8. N/A
9. AVEF's evaporation pond is engineered and is being operated such that any salt residue will not cause damage to crops grown in adjacent fields.

10. AVEF operates the plant such that it does not exceed HUD or EPA residential noise guidelines and OSHA worker safety noise standards.
11. AVEF's uses a zero discharge system for its cooling water.
12. AVEF's uses low profile structures, moderate stacks, neutral colors, compatible landscaping, and low intensity directed lighting for the plant as well as non-reflective conductors and towers.
13. AVEF has implemented a Land Management Plan that was filed with the Commission in April 2000. AVEF also has filed the required annual report with the Arizona Corporation Commission on June 14, 2001, June 18, 2002, and June 13, 2003, June 11, 2004, July 29, 2005, and July 5, 2006.
14. The plant meets all the requirements for the groundwater set forth in the Third Management Plan for the Phoenix Active Management Area.

Dynegy Arlington Valley, LLC (formerly LSP Arlington Valley, LLC post being Duke Energy Arlington Valley, LLC "Duke") submits this self-certification letter as required by Condition #23 of A.C.C. Decision 64717, which amended Decisions 64357 and 64495, (the "Decision") to describe conditions which have been met for calendar year 2007. As required by the A.C.C., copies of this letter are being submitted to the Arizona Attorney General and the directors of the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality, Department of Water Resources and Department of Commerce Energy Office.

The owner has not yet commenced construction of the Arlington Valley Energy Facility II ("AVEF II") and, therefore, many of the conditions in the Decision are not yet applicable. Nevertheless, the following conditions have been completed:

Condition #3 – Duke Energy Arlington Valley, LLC (former owner) filed its interconnection agreement with the commission on May 2, 2002. The agreement was filed in the AVEF I docket, but it applies to AVEF II as well. LSP Arlington Valley, LLC incorporates that filing by reference in the AVEF II docket. The agreement was with the LLC and remains with the LLC through the name change to LSP Arlington Valley, LLC.

Condition #4 – Dynegy owns 100% of the membership interests in Dynegy Arlington Valley, LLC, and is complying with all WECC requirements and as such is a member of the WECC

Condition #5 – The owner is a member of the Southwest Reserve Sharing Group. A copy of the FERC order accepting owner's membership effective February 4, 2003 was submitted with the self-certification letter on July 30, 2003. Membership was and remains with the Arlington Valley LLC.

Condition #8 – A Declaration of Restrictive Covenant was recorded on July 30, 2003. A copy of which was submitted with last year's self-certification letter on July 30, 2003.

Condition #9 – The owner erected a project sign as required by this condition. A photograph depicting said sign was submitted with the self-certification letter filed on July 30, 2003.

Condition #14 – This condition has already been put into effect as part of the AVEF I project and the most recent annual report on the plan was filed with docket control on June 11, 2004.

Condition #15 – The owner hosted the initial gas workshop on December 11, 2002, the second workshop in conjunction with the Arizona Association of Industries Energy Summit on November 18, 2003 and the third workshop on November 16, 2004. A report detailing the 2004 Gas Workshop is attached.

Condition #20 – The owner entered into an Incentive Recharge Contract with the Central; Arizona Water Conversation District. A copy of that contract was submitted with the self-certification letter of July 30, 2004. The contract was and remains with the Arlington Valley LLC.

Condition #21 – On November 11, 2003, the owner received an air quality permit revision incorporating LAER from the Maricopa County Environmental Services Department. Copies of the permit, the application, and extensive support documentation are on file with the Maricopa County Environmental Services Department.

Condition #25 – The owner has not pursued a legal challenge of any conditions in this Decision.

Condition #26 – The owner in conjunction with other power plant operators in the Palo Verde area, has developed and filed a Subsidence Monitoring Program. A copy of the initial baseline report was provided to the Arizona Department of Water Resources with copies to the Arizona Corporation Commission and the U.S. Geological Survey on July 7, 2003. An updated baseline survey was filed on March 10, 2005. A five year survey in underway.
