
I am really confused. In our Hillcrest Bay general membership meeting we voted to have our homeowners' Board of Directors go forward with the underground utilities project.

The Board then circulated a petition. The result was that 60% of the property owners said yes that the Board of Directors should go forward with the underground utilities project. Then came the provision that if the homeowners wanted to remove their names they could before January 8, 2008. It is my understanding that after January 8, 2008, the association still had the required percentage for this to go forward.

Then came the issue that some owners couldn't afford financially for this to go forward. The Board then put together a fund to help those homeowners who qualify as low-income residents. This fund was put in place to pay for the conversions for those owners. The contractor has also agreed to do five properties for free.\* Again, the Board of Directors, representing the majority of the association, cleared the way for this project to go forward.

This again is where I am confused. Having met all the stipulations, and I'm sure I'm not privy to all that have been met by the Board of Directors for Hillcrest Bay, I **cannot** understand how the minority of the population of Hillcrest Bay can be determining the outcome of this project that the majority voted to put in place. Why do the rules keep changing?
