Subject: Sulphur Springs Valley Electric Cooperative Proposed Rate Hike

Madam Chair and Commssioners,  
this subject bothers me from the standpoint that while Sulphur Springs wants the Arizona Corporate Commission to allow them to raise their rates, and yet SSVEC has continued to, in effect, tell the ACC "no, we are not going to submit a Net-metering Plan". Would it be within the ACC's jurisdiction or purview to tell SSVEC they must submit a Net-metering Plan, along with projected costs or revenues, including Net-Metering funds, to demonstrate a need for the rate hike?

It has been several months since the ACC had made the decision to make the Electric Cooperatives to include Net-metering in their services, and while Tucson Electric Power, and APS have initiated Net-metering plans, and while SSVEC has been very generous in providing solar electric systems for the local elementary schools, including on Ft Huachuca, and providing rebates for cooperative members who have solar systems installed, there have not been any announcements concerning a Net-metering plan.

I feel that here, in Arizona, Solar energy is the most reasonable avenue to lowering our bills, cleaning our air, lowering our dependence on foreign oil, without requiring drastic changes to the state infrastructure.


